Appendix 1: 2023 AGM Juniors Report

- There are currently 168 registered members.
- This is the first year that Juniors have been managed by a committee which loosely follows the same format as the Club Committee.
- The 'Dream team' registration on Sunday mornings is an essential part of the success of this section. They not only sign people in they now update Teamo which provides the coaches with valuable stats. They also organise second hand sales, raffles, fancy dress and are now selling Club socks. Shona has attended training once this season to date and Mad Dog has also been to the Magnus.
- The U8's has been closed to new players as the coaches feel that it would be unsafe to have more members in this group. There are 20+ training in the U10's group. Both the U12G and the U14 G have only small numbers training. The boys sections of these ages are flourishing and the U14b are unbeaten in their league.
- After Christmas all sections moved their older players up a group earlier to enable us to allow new members to join the U8's.
- The Junior section continues to support the DofE scheme which helps the older players gain their awards by giving up some of their time to assist with the training of the younger groups. This has been very successful over the years.
- The Primary School league is back with me as organiser and George Silver joins me every Wednesday to umpire the matches. There has been 10 schools taking part and the results table is on our website. I am currently also providing coaching to one school, Caunton on Mondays.
- I am hoping that either Beth Dickens, Claire Donald and Jacky Briggs will take this on next season as they are currently part of it.
- We have continued to take part in the Notts Derby friendly tournaments and the County In2 Hockey Tournament.

NoDe Friendly Tournaments: All age groups apart from the U16's have taken part in these friendly tournaments which have normally taken place at the Nottingham Hockey Centre.

County In2Hockey Competition: We entered both the U10's and U12's age groups, a girls team and a boys team in both. Both the U10 girls and U12 boys teams were successful and got through to the Midland part of the competition.

Midland In2 Hockey: The U10 girls play in the Midlands In2H competition on Sunday 16th April at Nottingham. The U12 boys will play in the Midlands In2H at Rugby on Sunday 23rd April. We have a number of junior players in the county programme.

Sam White Trophy: Again this involves the Primary Schools in the area. It will be taking place at the Magnus Pitch between 1230 and approx 1600 on Wednesday 26th April 2023.
